The Corn Products Company will not accept orders at any price provided that the orders that we send to them for one dock delivery do not aggregate 1000 pounds or more. In the event that we receive orders for smaller quantities, we shall obtain from usual local source of supply other than the Corn Products Company but the prices, of course, shall be higher. If purchasers would rather that we would not ship and would hold off until we can place orders with the Corn Products for 1000 pounds or more for one truck delivery, we shall hold up on such orders and shall ship when we can.

TO THE TRADE:-

February 14, 1941.

We are being so increasingly bound down by United States Government restrictions that we are unable beforehand to find out just what goods we will be allowed to ship and just what goods are being restricted and can be shipped only under U. S. Government Licenses.

Today, by Proclamation, we are forbidden to ship Oils of any kind in metal containers including, of course, Kerosene Oil, in metal drums or lubricating or edible oils in 5-gallon tins or containers of greater capacity. Consequently, we will not be shipping any of these items by current steamer. We will try to get licenses and if we get licenses we will ship by next opportunity.

Rope:-License has to be obtained for Rope. One of our great difficulties in connection with these licenses is that one of the stipulations of the government is that before licenses are issued we have to file report with the government of all such goods shipped to each particular consignee over a period of five years. The government we believe will then issue licenses for the exportation if the quantities being exported are not in excess of the average during the preceding five years. Unfortunately, however, the Department of the government in charge of the licenses is so deluged with applications that it might be two or three weeks or it might be a couple of months before licenses come to hand.

This situation, of course, is analogous to that covering metal goods of nearly every description concerning which we have already advised the trade generally by circular letter.

It would seem the logical thing to do would be to order anticipated requirements as far in advance as such requirements can be seen.
